## Citywide Garage Sale May 15-17: Register Your Sale Now!

The City of Lakeville is organizing a Citywide Garage Sale May 15-17. Lakeville residents can submit the address of their garage sale to be included on a map of sale locations.

In order to participate in the Citywide Garage Sale and have your location listed on the map, we require the information in our online form for verification purposes. Only your address and items available will be included on the map.

If you would like your sale location to appear on a printable map, you must register by



and officially sign up, you need to know your group's t-shirt sizes and approximately how many bags you will need (this information is required when you sign up).

We ask you to take the trash you've collected to local dumpster drop-off locations. Information will be sent out about the locations closer to the event. Don't leave bags along the curb or in parks. If you find items that are too heavy to deal with (furniture, tires, etc.), report it by sending an email to [environmental@lakevillemn.gov](mailto:environmental@lakevillemn.gov).

### Streets Division

Staff began sweeping collector roads and areas around the lakes.

### Utilities Division

Staff compiled a list of 136 residential meters to be changed out this year. Meters that were not compliant with the City's radio reading equipment were already replaced in 2022, which is why the replacement number is so low. An average yearly replacement project is 1,500 to 2,000 meters. The City has over 23,000 meters in the system.
