City Watering Ordinance

Odd/even and time-of-day watering restrictions are in effect now through September 30. Water only as needed on odd-numbered days if your house number ends in an odd number, or even-numbered days if your house number ends in an even number. Also, watering is not allowed between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m.—watering during the heat of the day wastes water due to evaporation.

Learn About Rules for Peddlers and Solicitors in Lakeville

Lakeville residents may see an increase this time of year in door-to-door salespeople. Here is some information on the door-to-door sales process and some definitions.

Residents who would prefer not to be contacted by peddlers or solicitors may display signage on their property indicating "No Peddlers or Solicitors" or "Peddlers and Solicitors Prohibited." You can download a sample sign at LakevilleMN.gov, search for *Peddlers*.

Peddler: Anyone who goes door-to-door attempting to sell items that are delivered immediately upon payment, such as vacuum cleaners or cleaning supplies. Peddlers must apply for a City-issued ID/license to conduct business as a peddler.

Solicitor: Anyone who goes door-to-door attempting to obtain orders for items that



will be delivered later, such as magazine subscriptions or other items that may be sold out of a catalog. Solicitors must register with the Lakeville Police Department and will receive a registration certificate.

Both peddlers and solicitors are required to display their ID card or registration certificate, or must present it if asked. Peddlers and solicitors are not allowed to go door-to-door between the hours of 8 p.m. and 9 a.m.

Certain groups or products are exempt from licensing requirements, including anyone selling or taking orders for any product grown or raised on a farm or garden; daily newspaper sales; or the sale of plants, flowers, Christmas trees or cookies by a nonprofit group such as Boy or Girl Scouts.

Peddlers and solicitors can be respectful and businesslike, or some may have more aggressive sales tactics. If you are uncomfortable with the behavior of any sales person who comes to your door, if they are unable to show you their City-issued ID or registration certificate, or if they refuse to leave your property, don't hesitate to call 911. Remember, you should call 911 for any situation where you need a police officer dispatched, even if you don't consider it to be an emergency.

STAFF UPDATE

Streets

Crews are continuing citywide spring street sweeping, working six days a week until complete. Currently the project is over 60% complete.

A crew has begun repairing sod damage caused by snowplows using the new hydroseeder machine that staff built over the winter.
