



## Lakeville Police Department Update

### Weekly Review

Please note, the Weekly Review does not include all calls to which the Lakeville Police Department responded. Incidents included here are based on severity, impact on public safety or other factors.

- Officers located a vehicle after it was called in as an erratic driver. The driver was showing signs of impairment, performed poorly on the standard field sobriety tests, and provided a preliminary breath test of .22. He was arrested and transported to Dakota County Jail.
- Officers stopped a vehicle for expired tabs, and the driver was found to have no insurance. The driver had numerous failures to appear on his record, and due to his ongoing criminal conduct, he was jailed and the vehicle was impounded.
- Multiple officers responded to a severe crash at Dodd Boulevard and 215<sup>th</sup> Street. A vehicle attempted to make a left turn onto Dodd Boulevard from the flashing yellow light and was struck by another vehicle traveling westbound on County Road 70. There was severe damage to the vehicle and serious injuries to the occupants who were transported to HCMC.
- An older female yellow lab was wandering near the intersection of 215<sup>th</sup> Street and Juniper Way. Community Service Officers impounded the dog at Dakota Pet Hospital.
- A citation was issued for failure to yield following a two-vehicle crash at the roundabout at 185<sup>th</sup> Street and Kenwood Trail.
- What came in as a driving complaint resulted in a traffic stop. The driver displayed signs of impairment and following the standard field sobriety testing, the driver provided a sample of .219 blood alcohol content. The driver was transported to Dakota County Jail for 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree DWI.
- Officers responded to a crash at County Road 46 and Kenrick Avenue. The at-fault driver admitted to looking down at his phone then rear-ending stopped traffic. Both vehicles were disabled, the at-fault driver was cited, and one party was transported for minor injuries.
- Officers responded to a medical call involving a female who woke up with respiratory issues. Upon arrival, the female was not breathing, and officers began CPR until Allina and LFD responded and transported the female to Fairview Ridges.
- Officers responded to an injury accident involving a car versus motorcycle at Kenwood Trail and Kenyon Avenue. The car did not yield to the motorcyclist resulting in a collision. The motorcyclist was transported with a leg injury, and the driver of the car was cited for failure to yield.
- Officers spoke with the victim of a theft from vehicle at 18XXX Iroquois Way. An unknown suspect entered the victims unlocked vehicle and stole money that was left in the console. A reminder to lock your vehicles and keep your valuables out of sight.
