Monday, October 6: Kawaii Cartoons

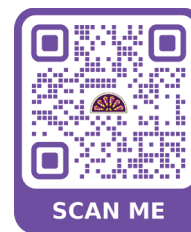

STAFF UPDATE

Streets Division

Crews are actively patching roads across the City as weather allows and are spray patching high iron areas in preparation for plow season.

Utilities Division

Staff are inspecting water and sewer infrastructure for next year's road projects, and are repairing manholes and gate valve boxes in roadways.

Environmental Resources

A contractor completed maintenance work at the Foxborough Park stormwater management basin. Installed in 2023, the basin helps reduce sediment loading by treating stormwater runoff before it flows into North Creek.
