Weekly Review

Please note, the Weekly Review does not include all calls to which the Lakeville Police Department responded. Incidents included here are based on severity, impact on public safety or other factors.

- Officers responded to a two-vehicle crash at 215th St W and Dodd Blvd after a driver with severely worn tires slid into a stopped vehicle while turning. The at-fault driver was cited. This serves as a reminder to check your tires during the winter season.
- Officers responded to a report of suspicious activity at a local carwash involving occupants acting erratically. During contact, one individual dropped a suspected substance, provided a false name, and was later found to have an active warrant. The individual was taken into custody and transported to Dakota County Jail.
- Officers corralled a yellow lab near 10XXX 185th St W and reunited it with its owner.
- Officers met with a fraud victim who reported losing \$15,000 after being contacted by someone impersonating the FBI. The victim wired funds and purchased gift cards at the scammer's direction. The investigation is ongoing, and this incident highlights the importance of verifying unexpected requests for money.
- Officers responded to a report of theft involving a kettle bell ringer stealing from a local store. While the suspect denied the allegation, video surveillance confirmed the theft and she was cited.
- A vehicle was impounded after multiple parking complaints and prior enforcement, as it remained parked on the street and was plowed around and buried in snow. This serves as a reminder that the winter street parking ordinance prohibits on-street parking from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m., November 1 through April 1.
- Officers responded to a crash near the 20XXX block of Holyoke Ave where the at-fault driver was turning onto Holyoke from a parking lot and pulled out in front of a vehicle with the right of way.
- Officers responded to a property damage crash at Cedar Ave and 160th St W caused by improper lane change. A citation was issued to the at-fault driver and no injuries were reported.
- Officers responded to a report of a disruptive and uncooperative guest at a business in the 7XXX block of 179th St W. The individual was located nearby and trespassed from the property at the request of management.
- Officers responded to a minor two-vehicle crash at 164th St W and Kenwood Trail after the at-fault driver was unable to stop when the vehicle ahead stopped for a school bus stop arm. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to drive with due care.
